Objective: Understand what it means to be a representative for the Air Force, your AFSC and family name.

MP1: Opening/Ice Breaker

Have Airman Snuffy walk into the room (Manipulate the uniform; i.e. keys hanging out of their pockets, buttons undone etc.) What do you think of this person's behavior? Do they embody the standards, uniform and personal hygiene to represent the Air Force well? What's our first impression? Would you want this person to represent you as an ambassador for the Air Force?

MP2: Guided Group Discussion

Break down the definition of Ambassador by writing the definition on the board for all Airmen to view. (Ambassador: a person who acts as a representative or promoter of a specified activity)The purpose of this would be to identify what are some examples of typical Air Force ambassadors? (MTI, MTL, recruiter, thunder birds) What do they all have in common? (The way they look, act, etc. and what does that say about the Air Force?) "Perception is reality"
