Brig. Gen. Bonnie J. Bosler is the Director for the Department of the Air Force Integrated Resilience Office, the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia. She is responsible for all matters relating to the strategic planning, research and development, and implementation of the Air Force resiliency programs to optimize Airmen and Guardian Performance.

Brig. Gen. Bosler graduated from Liberty University in 1993. In 1997, she was awarded a direct commission to the Air Force Nurse Corps. She began her career at the 714th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron at McGuire Air Force Base, where she attained her initial qualification as a flight nurse. Throughout her career, Brig. Gen. Bosler served in several leadership positions, including senior flight nurse examiner, chief nurse and commander. She deployed in support of operations Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom, and New Dawn. She has accrued more than 3,400 flight hours in C-141, C-130, KC-135, C-9 and C-17 aircraft. Prior to her current position, she served as the Mobilization Assistant to the AMC Command Surgeon, Air Mobility Command, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois.
